
A sincere thank you to Mr Rhys Sutherland for his dedication and leadership in guiding the choir through this memorable experience.


Faction Carnival

Design and Technology in Room 8

During our Design and Technologies lessons we made spaceships. The students were given a task to construct a spaceship less than 50cm in height, using mostly recycled materials.

We followed the design process steps by:

- · Researching different types of space craft
- · Designing our own spaceship, using labelled drawings
- Selecting appropriate materials and equipment to make them
- Evaluating our design and discussing any problems

All students worked hard to create their own unique spaceship and also enjoyed helping each other.





Year 5 in Earth and Space

The Year 5 students have been busy exploring the fascinating world of Earth and Space, recently focusing on the moon.

They have been investigating how the moon appears to change shape as it orbits Earth, moving through its eight distinct phases from new moon to full moon and back again.

To bring this learning to life, students took part in a hands-on activity using Oreo biscuits to model each phase.

This creative approach helped them visualise the lunar cycle in a fun and memorable way, while reinforcing their scientific understanding of how and why these changes occur. Learning has never been so sweet!

Welcome to the latest update from our vibrant art room!

The students across all year levels are diving into exciting projects that explore line, colour, shape, form, and sculpture!

The Pre-Primary students have been exploring the element of line through whimsical artworks inspired by wildflowers and shooting stars. These imaginative projects are helping our youngest artists build early drawing and mark-making skills while expressing their creativity.

Ihe students in Years 1 and 2 have been introduced to the abstract world of Wassily Kandinsky, focusing on his famous work Squares with Concentric Circles (1913).

Through this, they are learning how colour and shape can work together to express emotion and rhythm in art.

Meanwhile, Year 4 and 5 students are exploring form in sculpture, working with plaster of Paris to create dynamic animal sculptures.

This tactile medium is helping them understand the three-dimensional qualities of art and the importance of structure and balance. The students Years 3 and 4 have recently completed their charming clay pinch pot owls, beautifully painted and full of personality. They're now turning their attention to monochromatic colour schemes, discovering how varying shades of

a single colour can create depth and mood.

The Year 2 and 3 students are embarking on a

vibrant journey into Asian art, starting with imaginative fusion dragon creations that

blend cultural motifs with their own unique

ideas. This unit encourages students to experiment with pattern, symbolism, and

The Year 5 and 6 students continue their exciting journey into Pop Art, now creating bold and playful plaster of Paris doughnut sculptures. The bright colours and fun inspire these eye-catching works.






